At long last there is a real prospect of an easing of restrictions. We thought the same at the end of last summer. But this time, with the vaccination programme advancing, perhaps there will be no false dawn. For Faith at Work in Worcestershire very little chaplaincy is possible at the moment, but we are well placed to meet the challenges the rest of the year brings.

 Firstly, we have just started a 6 week training course with a record number of participants (see below). That bodes well for the future.



- We also have clear guidance and training in place for all current chaplains as lockdown ends to enable those who plan to return to re-start chaplaincy as soon as it is possible. If you are one of those chaplains and are wondering about your next steps, please get in touch.
- We are also busy trying to build links with new businesses. In recent years FWW chaplains have mostly been visiting in the retail sector. We want to broaden this and have been following a number of strategies, even during lockdown. This includes searching for new volunteers with experience of business who can help us build these new links. Read more about our aim to recruit Business Partnership Volunteers below.
- But we have also be using our membership of the Chamber of Commerce to meet fellow members through online networking events. So far this has been undertaken by Dick. If you would be interested to take part and fly the flag for FWW in this way, please get in touch.

Our aim, by the end of the year, is to have more chaplains, visiting more numbers and types of workplaces. Please help us realise this vision. Help us recruit one or more **Business Partnership Volunteers**. We started this process as we re-entered lockdown and have not yet been successful in finding anyone. This is a key new role in the development and expansion of workplace chaplaincy in Worcestershire.

The purpose is to make links with businesses and organisations on behalf of FWW in order to promote chaplaincy, but also explore other ways to connect with the world of business. We are particularly keen to broaden our links with the manufacturing sector.

We are looking for people with experience in business, who understand the culture and challenge of the modern workplace, and perhaps already have links and contacts. Someone recently retired would be ideal, who could volunteer for a half day or more per week.
