## Signs of Hope and New Beginnings

This year Holy Week and Easter have a particular poignancy as lockdown eases. Our following Jesus to the Cross, and anticipation of the joy of Easter Resurrection, connects with the continuing challenges and suffering that so many have had to face, but also with the new possibilities that Resurrection brings.

This applies to ourselves, as we look forward to meeting friends and family, but also to many aspects of the economy. FWW chaplains have not been able to visit workplaces for many months. As lockdown eases some businesses will not re-open and there will be many still very uncertain about the future. Others will be keen to grasp this new beginning.

As reported in our previous newsletter (Feb 23<sup>rd</sup>) FWW has been busy preparing for this time of resuming chaplaincy. We have completed, on Zoom, the Introduction to Workplace Chaplaincy Course and are now looking forward to some new chaplains joining the team. For those keen to return to chaplaincy we have produced updated guidance, which is available **on our website here**, and which we are discussing with chaplains. The vaccination programme makes visiting a real possibility, and we have now taken the first step in registering under the government scheme for home Lateral Flow tests. This has just been extended from employers to charities, to allow volunteers to get back to volunteering. Lateral Flow tests are also available in designated centres around the county.

On April 12<sup>th</sup> we anticipate non-essential shops will re-open, which is where many of our chaplains visit. Although all these measures make chaplaincy possible once again, we are stressing that chaplains should only return if they feel safe and confident in doing so.

So, as the economy continues to open up, presenting new opportunities and beginnings, but also fresh challenges, we ask all our supporters to pray for those who volunteer as chaplains – and for those they visit. And may all know and be able to celebrate the new possibilities that Resurrection brings.
